Grants Work in Our Community

The Chisholm Community Foundation was born over 30 years ago by "doers" with a vision to cultivate the same spirit in others in Chisholm. This year's grants are again a testament to the success of this vision and the need to continue to foster it. We take time to highlight a few of our 2019 grants and the work these entities do for our community. We challenge you to continue in this tradition whether it's through applying for grants, donations to the CCF or helping with these local projects and groups.

This year, Carousel Volunteer & Donation Center identified a need for school supplies, hygiene products and food sources. They submitted a grant application for the "Chisholm School Supply Pantry". This project will allow students access to a "pantry" that houses necessary supplies that will directly benefit and promote care for the students. Additionally, this program will help to ease and reduce stress on the entire family. Parents have many reasons why they may have difficulty providing the essentials to their families and this program will help to alleviate some of those needs. The CCF thought this was a very worthwhile project and awarded \$10,000 to aid in providing essentials to the students of Chisholm High.

We awarded \$1,300 to the Range Engineering Council (REC). REC is the creation of local engineers, including Chisholm native Julie Varichak Marinucci. They identified a need: to create more STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering & Math) opportunities for regional students and teach them how they are applicable to our regional workforce. It has since expanded to include many professionals working in STEM. It relies on its professionals to create partnerships with local industries to create opportunities to expose students to the diverse and innovative STEM career opportunities in our region. This year, we supported the Iron Range STEM Showcase, which highlights the regional STEM opportunities by our local industries to over 2,000 students from 28 school districts. We are grateful to support this group's ability to highlight our regional career opportunities with the goal of retaining students to grow our regional economy.

We also awarded \$5,072 to the Iron Range Off-Road Cyclists' project—the Redhead Regional Mountain Bike Park. This group is making strides toward creating a park nearby the Minnesota Discovery Center. Recent studies situate supporting this pastime squarely within CCF's mission to support projects responsive to community and economic development. Such studies indicate that rural counties with strong outdoor recreational activities retain and add population at higher rates than comparative counties without such opportunities, as well as support the local tourism economy.

Our full list of 2019 grants is on page 6. They are all impressive projects with positive community impact and have two common features: dedicated citizens who identify a community need and CCF support to make possible a solution. Leonardo da Vinci once said, "It had long since come to my attention that people of accomplishment rarely sat back and let things happen to them. They went out and happened to things."
