

### Senator David J. Tomassoni Bridge of Peace Memorial

SENATOR DAVID J. TOMASSONI BRIDGE OF PEACE VIEW OF ARCH TOWARDS DOWNTOWN

In honor of the late Senator David J. Tomassoni, a memorial arch and recreational plaza will be built on the Senator David J. Tomassoni Bridge of Peace, located on the Longyear Lake causeway in Chisholm, Minnesota. The archway honoring the late Senator is recognition for his 30 years of service in the Minnesota legislature and the many economic initiatives he directly and indirectly championed in area industry and the people of his district. His career delivered billions of dollars to help sustain the economy of the Iron Range – particularly natural resources such as mining and forest products. The memorial will also honor the Iron Range veterans of all military conflicts, many of whom paid the ultimate sacrifice.





### Non-profit Status

#### **CCF Mission Statement**

The CCF's mission is to be a steward of funds for innovative and creative projects that are responsive to community and economic development in the areas of social service, education, arts and culture, conservation and historic and environmental preservation.

### Senator Tomassoni's Career Accomplishments:

- Senator Tomassoni helped secure millions of dollars in capital investment for plants and equipment for the taconite companies, working in cooperation with the Steelworkers by passing and approving annual investment tax credits for the taconite companies.
- He secured millions of dollars for the U of M's Natural Resources Research Institute to improve taconite production and research into DRI, using taconite tailings for construction, and other innovative research for mining.
- He proposed bills to streamline the permitting processes for mining, providing certainty for companies.
- He passed a law prohibiting the teardown of shutdown taconite plants—which helped preserve National Steel.
- When the industry hit tough times, he secured passage of extended unemployment benefits for steelworkers—which insured a stable workforce when the taconite plants reopened.

- He partnered with Senator Bakk on State Park expansion on USS lands near Lake Vermillion.
- He vigorously fought for the advancement of nonferrous mining for jobs for future generations and overall development of the region.
- He created the Iron Range Scholarship from mining royalties that now supports over 20% of the incoming freshmen at the University of Minnesota. He worked tirelessly for educational opportunities for all ages.
- He was in support of paper, pulp and biomass expansions such as Huber Manufacturing and the Hibbing-Virginia Laurentian Energy Authority (LEA).
- He worked thoughtfully with Minnesota Power and other State utilities on mercury emissions reductions and renewable energy expansion, including Taconite Ridge wind and Heliene Solar plant manufacturing and jobs.
- He was a key leader (along with a team of federal and local politicians/leaders) in securing the location of the Iron Range Reservations Call Center (Northwest/Delta) in Chisholm, Minnesota. This project brought significant jobs with great benefits to the Iron Range area and job diversity to the region.
- He supported many projects that created jobs, bolstering broad band while diversifying the Iron Range economy and strengthening transportation options. He also secured funding for the Range Regional Airport
- He passed special legislation that specifically ensured adequate funding for Range Center, Inc., a large nonprofit organization serving adults and children with developmental disabilities.
- He fought for care for the elderly and the mentally ill and worked to ensure people have the health care they deserve. He secured funding to help research Mesothelioma lung disease in miners.
- As a son of a veteran, he has supported veteran care and our military.
- He was instrumental in bringing recreation opportunities to the Iron Range such as the 132-mile Mesabi Bike Trail, public campgrounds area wide, the state's on only Off Highway Vehicle Park located here on the Iron Range, and securing funding to reclaim an iron ore pit turning it into the world class Redhead Mountain Bike Park.

In June of 2021, Senator Tomassoni was diagnosed with ALS, also known as Lou Gehrig's disease. In his last session, fighting the physical challenges from the disease, Senator Tomassoni stuck to his values. He was able to pass legislation that will provide \$20 million to ALS research and \$5 million to caregiver support. He himself was not able to see the benefits from this bill, but he knew how important this legislation would be to his constituents.

Senator Tomassoni passed away on August 11, 2022.

The start of the school year is my favorite time of the year. Lots of laughter and excitement fill our school grounds with the return of students and staff. There are some new faces here in the Chisholm School District. We welcomed in a new E-6 Principal, Mrs. Karla Winter, and a new Buildings and Grounds Supervisor, Mike Fredeen. We also have implemented some new mental health support through North Homes Children and Family Services as well as providing Check-N-Connect supports throughout our school district funded by a grant through St. Louis County.

We also are very excited to launch our new Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (STEM) Lab at the Chisholm Elementary School. Students will be building robots, flying drones, building circuits and many other fun and exciting STEM lessons throughout the year. The lab also doubles as an ESports Lab where students participate in team gaming.

I was recently asked what I liked best about being Superintendent in Chisholm. My response was the strong sense of community pride and support of our school district. This summer, the Chisholm All Class Reunion proved this to be true. The buildings were filled with former students taking tours where I heard over and over again "keep schools in Chisholm."

One of the most exciting things about the school district will be voted on November 8th. There will be two questions on the ballot:

- 1. Operating Levy renewal
- 2. Building Bond Referendum
  - Our current Operating Levy is about to expire. The school district is not asking for an increase but rather status quo. The operating levy provides the school district funds for classrooms, instruction and other school operating costs.
  - The Building Bond Referendum is for a \$32 million new Early Childhood through 6th grade building. This would be located in the current parking lot of the High School and attached to the gymnasium. Two of our school buildings are over 100 years old. The repair costs far outweigh the new building cost. The new building would provide better air quality, heating and cooling, as well as 21st Century learning spaces. This addition preserves the auditorium and gymnasium as well as adding a new additional gymnasium and cafeteria. Safe and secure entrances as well as bus pick up and drop off safety will be addressed in this plan.

sisted in planning and helping with the event. Thanks so much for your support, Paul & Suzi!


