applied for and received four grants totaling over \$52,000 over the past several years leading up to the completion of the park. According to the CBA, the headframe was built in 1926 by the Harvester Company. The steel structure was used to take miners into the underground mine, and then haul iron ore up to the rail cars. It would go over 700 feet down. The headframe park serves as a commemoration of the history of the site, as well as a resting spot and launching point for Mesabi Trail riders to enjoy all of the history. Dave Pessenda, Vice Chair of the Chisholm Beautification Association, notes that "the Bruce Mine Park project will help to preserve and remember the past and all the immigrants who came to this country and developed it into what it is today. Without the CCF, we would've struggled more to meet our financial goal. We very much appreciate the grant

awards we received and thank the CCF for all they do for the community".

The Chisholm Splash Pad is a legacy project for the Chisholm Kiwanis Club in commemoration with its 100th anniversary in 2020. The Club was awarded a \$50,000 grant from Kiwanis International Legacy of Play competition to kickstart the project. The competition involved public online voting, in which the Chisholm project received the most votes! Later in 2022, the CCF awarded \$30,000 toward the project.



The remainder of funding secured for the roughly \$190,000 addition to the park is a combination of other grants, donations and proceeds from fundraisers, according to Club President Shannon Kishel -Roche. "The Chisholm Kiwanis Club hopes that the Splash Pad, our 100th Anniversary Project, will be enjoyed by all residents and visitors for many years to come. This project serves as a visual reminder of the cooperation and support of area businesses and organizations in our community," noted Kishel-Roche. Both projects were designed by Architectural Resources, Inc. of Hibbing.

I've served in several different administrative roles here as Activities Director and Principal. I'm looking forward to the new role as we have a lot of new things happening in the district.

I want to recognize the Chisholm Community Foundation
