The smiles were plentiful up and down the Main Street on August 5, 2017 when the Chisholm Community Foundation, along with 42 other sponsors, hosted Slide the City. Slide the City, a family-friendly slip and slide water party event, brought over 5,000 people of all ages from across the Range and the U.S. to Chisholm's Main Street, where a 1,000 foot water slide was set up. Over 60 volunteers helped throughout the day and evening to make this one of the most successful and fun-filled events ever to take place in our community. More than 2,300 people went down the slide. All proceeds from local ticket sales benefitted the CCF. Special thanks go out to the City of Chisholm, Chisholm Police Department, Chisholm Ambulance, and City Crew Workers. *A tentative date of July 14, 2018 has been scheduled to bring Slide the City back to town.*

2017 was a very busy year for the Chisholm Community Foundation and its board. For those of you unfamiliar with our events, below is a narrative of what we did throughout the year.

Our first event was the March Madness Burger Bash sponsored by and held at Valentini's Supper Club. The goal of this event was to do something during a slower time of the year. The turnout was great and Valentini's donated proceeds from the event.

April and May are very busy months for the CCF board. We have many committee meetings regarding grants and scholarships. This is a very fun and interesting part of being on the board, but it can also be very difficult. The grant and scholarship committees must decide who best qualifies to receive money—which is never an easy decision. The committees then make their recommendations to the CCF board and, if approved by the board, the money is awarded to the respective applicants. In 2017, the CCF granted \$117,518 to organizations in and around our community. Included in that \$117,518 was \$9,460 to Chisholm High School Seniors for scholarships.

Our annual golf outing took place on July 31, 2017 at the Mesaba Country Club. 128 golfers participated in the event and, with the help of a number of dedicated volunteers, we hosted another successful tourney. The Chisholm Area Chamber of Commerce once again conducted the raffles, which definitely adds to the final outcome of the event. On August 5, 2017, the CCF helped sponsor Slide the City and it turned out to be the talk of not only Chisholm, but the whole state of Minnesota. A 1,000 foot waterslide was set up on our Main Street where approximately 2,300 people purchased tickets and over 5,000 were in attendance. An entire year of planning went into this event and, because of

the involvement of the CCF board, numerous other financial sponsors and the whole community of Chisholm, it turned out to be a very successful and very fun, family-oriented day.

The All Class Reunion took place the following week and the CCF celebrated its 30th Anniversary with a wine tasting event at Valentini's. The event was open to the public as a way for people to learn about the CCF.

During October, Valentini's Supper Club sponsored the bar at the annual Minnesota Deer Hunters Banquet and donated the proceeds to the CCF. This is a great opportunity for the CCF to maintain old relationships and create new ones.

The Keyboard Liquor sponsors the last event of the year with their annual Holiday Wine Tasting Festival. This year is the 10th anniversary of the wine tasting and will be held on Friday, December 1st at Valentini's. This is a wonderful social event and Paul and Suzi donate the proceeds from the event to the CCF.
